10–11 a.m., Jones Building, second floor (hallway closest to San Jacinto)

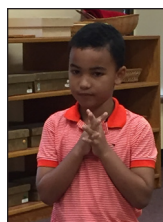

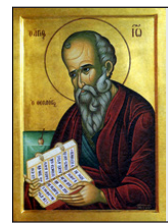
These casual groups convene for Bible study and fellowship both downtown and in northwest Houston.
