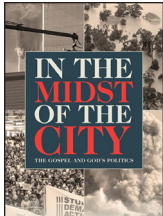
10–11 a.m., *Reynolds Hall*

Dean Thompson will explore our relationship to God in literature by leading us through works of great Southern writers Flannery O'Connor, and Wendell Berry.

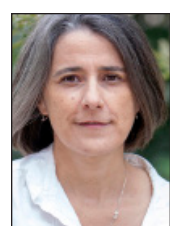
A Celebration of 25 Years (Nov. 18)

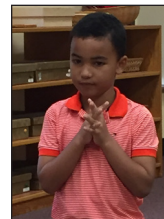

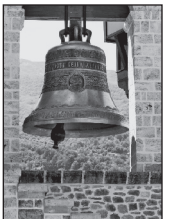

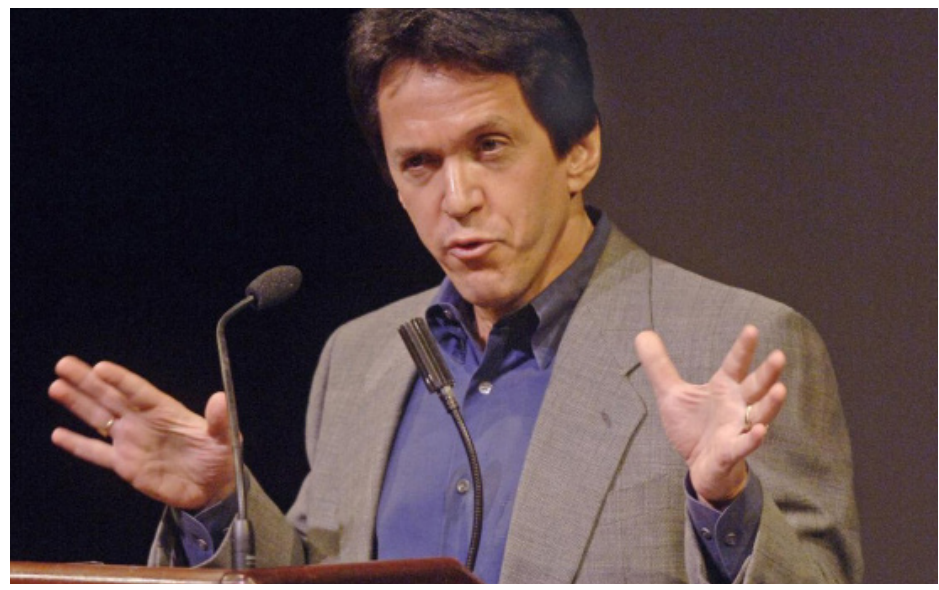
